Part 13 - Resurrection - Imperishability AND THEN Immortality

1 Timothy 6:16. who alone possesses immortality and dwells in unapproachable light, whom no man has seen or can see. To Him be honor and eternal dominion! Amen.

Genesis 2:7. Then the LORD God formed man of dust from the ground, and breathed into his nostrils the breath of life; **and man became a living being.**

nephesh - a soul, living being, life, self, person, desire, passion, appetite, emotion


KJV:

7 And the Lord God formed man of the dust of the ground, and breathed into his nostrils the breath of life; **and man became a living soul.**

Leviticus 17:11. For the **life** (nephesh) of the flesh is in the blood, and I have given it to you on the altar to make atonement for your souls; for it is the blood by reason of the life that makes atonement.'

1 Corinthians 15:52-54

52 in a moment (atomo), in the twinkling of an eye, at the last trumpet; for the trumpet **WILL** sound, and the dead **WILL** be raised imperishable, and we **WILL** be changed.



From verse 52:

"The dead will be raised" = Verb, Future, Passive, Indicative, 3rd Person, Plural
"We will be changed" = Verb, Future, Passive, Indicative, 1st Person, Plural

53 For this perishable must **PUT ON** (*to clothe with, in the sense of sinking into a garment*) the **IMPERISHABLE**, and this mortal must **PUT ON** (*to clothe with, in the sense of sinking into a garment*) **IMMORTALITY.**

54 But **WHEN** (time involved) this perishable will have **PUT ON** the imperishable, **AND** this mortal will have (again time involved) **PUT ON** immortality, **THEN** (time involved) **WILL** come about the saying that is written, "**DEATH IS SWALLOWED UP in victory.**

4 'put ons' in 2 verses.

imperishable (aphtharsia) = the body is incapable of decay, but not to harm and death. Whereas;

immortality (athanasia) = the body is completely harm AND DEATH proof.

Philippians 2:5. Have this attitude in yourselves which was also in Christ Jesus,

1 Corinthians 15:54 But **WHEN** (*time involved*) this perishable will have **PUT ON** the imperishable, **AND** this mortal will have (*again time involved*) **PUT ON** immortality, **THEN** (*time involved*) **WILL** come about the saying that is written, "**DEATH IS SWALLOWED UP in victory.**

1 Corinthians 15:20-26

20 But now Christ has been raised from the dead, the first fruits of those who are asleep.

21 For since by a man came death, by a man also came the resurrection of the dead.

Philippians 1:20..... according to my earnest expectation and hope'.

22 For as in Adam **all** (all in a categorical limitation) die, so also in Christ **all** (all in a categorical limitation) **WILL** be made alive.

24 **THEN** comes the end,

......WHEN (time involved) He hands over the kingdom to the God and Father, WHEN (again time involved) He has abolished all rule and all authority and power.

25 For He must reign **UNTIL** (again time involved) **He has put all His enemies under His feet.**

26 The last enemy that **WILL** be abolished is death.

Hebrews 12:1-3

1 Therefore, since we have so great a cloud of witnesses surrounding us, let us also lay aside every encumbrance and the sin which so easily entangles us, and let us run with endurance the race that is set before us,

Hebrews 11:13 All these died in faith, without receiving the promises, but having seen them and having welcomed them from a distance, and having confessed that they were strangers and exiles on the earth.

- 2 fixing our eyes on Jesus, the author and perfecter of faith, who for the **JOY SET BEFORE** Him endured the cross, despising the shame, and has sat down at the right hand of the throne of God.
- 3 For **CONSIDER** (think upon, consider attentively) Him who has endured such hostility by sinners against Himself, so that you will not grow weary and lose heart.
