2 Peter 3:14-16 14 Therefore, beloved, since you look for these things, be diligent to be found by Him in peace, spotless and blameless, 15 and regard the patience of our Lord as salvation; just as also **our beloved brother Paul**, **according to the wisdom given him, wrote to you**, 16 as also in all his letters, speaking in them of these things, **in which are some things hard to understand**, which the untaught and unstable distort, as they do also the rest of the Scriptures, to their own destruction.

Philippians 1:7 For it is only right for me to feel this way about you all, because I have you in my heart, since both **in my imprisonment** and in the defense and confirmation of the gospel, you all are **partakers of grace** with me.

- **13** so that my **imprisonment** in the cause of Christ has become well known throughout the whole praetorian guard and to everyone else,
- 14 and that most of the brethren, <u>trusting in the Lord because</u> of my imprisonment, have far more courage to speak the word of God without fear.

Colossians 4:18 I, Paul, write this greeting with my own hand. **Remember my imprisonment.** Grace be with you.

2 Timothy 3:16-17 16 All Scripture is inspired by God and profitable <u>for</u> teaching, <u>for</u> reproof, <u>for</u> correction, <u>for</u> training in righteousness; 17 so that the man of God may be adequate, equipped for every good work.

So what did we just read there? Well firstly that ALL scripture **has a purpose**: so we can derive from that verse namely **4 purposes**: lets briefly touch on them, I will give a reference example for each:

FOR **DOCTRINE**; (right believing);

FOR **REPROOF**; (reproving us when we are not adhering rightly to the doctrine);

FOR **CORRECTION**; (pointing us back to right believing)

"FOR training in righteousness";

Galatians 1:6-10 I am amazed that you are so quickly <u>deserting Him</u> who called you by the grace of Christ, **for a different gospel**;

7 <u>which is really not another</u>; only there are some **who are disturbing** you and want to distort the gospel of Christ.

8 But even if we, or an angel from heaven, should preach to you a gospel contrary to what we have preached to you, he is to be accursed!

9 As we have **said before**, **so I say again now**, if any man is preaching to you **a gospel contrary to what you received**, **he is to be accursed!**

10 For am I now seeking the favor of men, or of God? Or am I striving to please men? If I were still trying to please men, I would not be a bond-servant of Christ.

Contextomy

Removing a passage from its surrounding matter in such a way as to distort its intended meaning.

Scope - EW Bullinger:

"When we speak of the "Scope" we mean—what it is all about; the one subject which is being treated of, or written about. This **will always** furnish a key to the meaning of the words employed".
