The Synopsis
Job Chapters 1-42

Parts 1-4 God's Sovereignty His love and wrath are covered.

Covers the devastating flood at the beginning of this age.

Parts 4 & 5; John 3:16 is looked at in it's immediate and more remote contexts, where the term "world" is defined in the context of the revelation in John's gospel where it is used and defined in some detail.
