

The Three Cohortative Subjunctives (Verses 22–25)

Reference	Translation	Theological Core	Exegetical Focus
Verse 22 Προσερχώμεθα <i>(Proserchōmetha)</i>	"Let us draw near"	Faith (<i>pistis</i>)	Instructs the reader to move toward the heavenly sanctuary with full, unshakeable assurance. This relies on internal cleansing ("hearts sprinkled") and external identification ("bodies washed").
Verse 23 Κατέχωμεν <i>(Katechōmen)</i>	"Let us hold fast"	Hope (<i>elpis</i>)	A highly intense verb meaning to firmly retain or secure a grip. The object is the "confession of hope." It is qualified as "without wavering" or "unbending", anchored entirely in the character of God ("faithful is the One who promised").
Verses 24-25 Κατανοῶμεν <i>(Katanoōmen)</i>	"Let us consider"	Love (<i>agapē</i>)	Requires attentive, continuous observation of one another. The goal is "to stir up, provoke." While often used negatively for irritation, here it demands a positive provocation toward love and good deeds, sustained by "not abandoning" the local assembly.
