Job 34:1-37

Job 32:4 Now Elihu had waited to speak to Job because they were years older than he.

Job 33:1 "However now, Job, please hear my speech,

- 1. Man must assess his direct actions towards God. Verses 1-9
- 2. Man must assess that these direct actions towards God are right.

Verses 10-29

3. Mans response to God must be one of repentance. Verses 30-37



1 Peter 4:12-19 ¹² Beloved, **do not be surprised** at the fiery ordeal among you, which comes upon you for your testing, as though some strange thing were happening to you; ¹³ **but to the degree that you share the sufferings** of Christ, **keep on rejoicing**, **so that** also at the revelation of His glory you may **rejoice with exultation**. ¹⁴ If you are reviled for the name of Christ, you are blessed, because the Spirit of glory and of God rests on you. ¹⁵ Make sure that none of you suffers as a murderer, or thief, or evildoer, or a troublesome meddler; ¹⁶ but if anyone suffers as a Christian, he is not to be ashamed, but is to glorify God in this name. ¹⁷ For it is time for judgment to begin with the household of God; and if it begins with us first, what will be the outcome for those **who do not obey the gospel of God?** ¹⁸ And if it is with difficulty that the righteous is saved, what will become of the godless man and the sinner? ¹⁹ Therefore, those also who suffer according to the will of God shall entrust their souls to a faithful Creator in doing what is right.

1. Man must assess his direct actions towards God. Verses 1-9

Job 34: 1 Then Elihu continued and said,2 "Hear my words, you wise men,specifically addressing the 3 friendsAnd listen to me, you who know.

Job 12:1-2 Then Job responded, 2 "Truly then you are the people, And with you wisdom will die!

Job 34: ³ "For the ear tests words As the palate tastes food.

John 10:1-5¹ "Truly, truly, I say to you, he who does not enter by the door into the fold of the sheep, but climbs **up some other way**, he is a thief and a robber. ² But he who enters by the door is a shepherd of the sheep. ³ To him the doorkeeper opens, and **the sheep hear his voice**, and **he calls his own sheep** by name and leads them out. ⁴ When he puts forth all his own, he goes ahead of them, and the sheep follow him **because they know his voice**. ⁵ **A stranger they simply will not follow, but will flee from him**, because they do not know the voice of strangers."

Matthew 23:13 But woe to you, scribes and Pharisees, hypocrites, because you shut off the kingdom of heaven from people; for you do not enter in yourselves, nor do you allow those who are entering to go in.

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Matthew 23:27-28 Woe to you, scribes and Pharisees, hypocrites! For you are like whitewashed tombs which **on the outside** <u>appear</u> <u>beautiful</u>, but <u>inside</u> they are full of dead men's bones and all uncleanness.²⁸ So you, too, outwardly <u>appear</u> righteous to men, but <u>inwardly</u> you are full of hypocrisy and lawlessness.

Job 34 ⁴ "Let us **choose** for ourselves what is right; Let us know among ourselves what is good.

Choose - choose after careful examination.

⁵ "For Job has said, 'I am righteous,

But God has taken away my right;

I am righteous – in this context to be right or innocent.

Remember when Job said this, way back?

Job 13:18 Behold now, I have prepared my case; I know that I will be vindicated.

Found NOT guilty.

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Job 23:10-11 But He knows the way I take; When He has tried me, I shall come forth as gold. ¹¹ "My foot has held fast to His path; I have kept His way and not turned aside.

Job 34: 6 Should I lie concerning my right?My wound is incurable, though I am without transgression.'

Wound – my arrows which cause the wounds.

I am without transgression – Job was not saying here he was perfect, but that the current trials were not directly related to specific sins he was guilty of.

⁷ "What man is like Job,Who drinks up derision like water,

Job 15:16 How much less one who is detestable and corrupt, Man, who drinks iniquity like water!

Job 34 ⁸ Who goes in company with the workers of iniquity,
And walks with wicked men?
⁹ "For he has said, 'It profits a man nothing
When he is pleased with God.'

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Job 9:22 "It is all one; therefore I say, 'He destroys the guiltless and the wicked.'

Job 21:1-16 ¹ Then Job answered, ² "Listen carefully to my speech, And let this be your way of consolation. ³ "Bear with me that I may speak; Then after I have spoken, you may mock. ⁴ "As for me, is my complaint to man? And why should I not be impatient? ⁵ "Look at me, and be astonished, And put your hand over your mouth. ⁶ "Even when I remember, I am disturbed, And horror takes hold of my flesh.

⁷ "Why do the wicked still live,

Continue on, also become very powerful?

⁸ "Their descendants are established with them in their sight,

And their offspring before their eyes,

⁹ Their houses are safe from fear,

And the rod of God is not on them.

¹⁰ "His ox mates without fail;

His cow calves and does not abort.

New American Standard Bible-NASB ¹¹ "They send forth their little ones like the flock, And their children skip about. ¹² "They sing to the timbrel and harp And rejoice at the sound of the flute. ¹³ "They spend their days in prosperity, And suddenly they go down to Sheol. ¹⁴ "They say to God, 'Depart from us! We do not even desire the knowledge of Your ways. ¹⁵ 'Who is the Almighty, that we should serve Him, And what would we gain if we entreat Him?' ¹⁶ "Behold, their prosperity is not in their hand; The counsel of the wicked is far from me.

2. Man must assess that his direct actions towards God are right. Verses 10-29

Job 34 ¹⁰ "Therefore, listen to me, you men of understanding. *Using sarcasm*

here again

Far be it from God to do wickedness, And from the Almighty to do wrong.

Far be it from God - We read over this in English, but in Hebrew it is a serious statement of abhorrence.

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Genesis 18:25 Far be it from You to do such a thing, to slay the righteous with the wicked, so that the righteous and the wicked are treated alike. **Far be it from You!** Shall not the Judge of all the earth deal justly?"

Job 34: ¹¹ "For He pays a man according to his work, And makes him find it according to his way.

Job 34: ¹² "Surely, God will not act wickedly,

And the Almighty **will not** pervert justice.

¹³ "Who gave Him authority over the earth?

And who has laid on Him the whole world?

¹⁴ "If He should determine to do so,

If He should **gather to Himself His spirit and His breath**, *only occurrence* ¹⁵ All flesh would perish together, And man would return to dust.

Ecclesiastes 12:7 then the dust will return to the earth as it was, and the spirit will return to God who gave it.

Listen to the sound of my words.

²⁴ "He breaks in pieces mighty men **without inquiry**, *no investigation*

And sets others in their place.

²⁵ "Therefore **He knows their works**,

And He overthrows them in the night,

And they are crushed.

People-upper class

No force involved

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²⁶ "He strikes them like the wicked **In a public place**, *RSV* "*in return for their*

wickedness"

In a public place – highly visible

²⁷ Because they turned aside from following Him,

And had no regard for any of His ways;

²⁸ So that **they caused** the cry of the poor to come to Him, And that He might hear the cry of the afflicted—

They caused-shows the results of the wicked actions.

²⁹ When He keeps quiet, who then can condemn?And when He hides His face, who then can behold Him,That is, in regard to both nation and man?—

3. Mans response to God must be one of repentance. Verses 30-37

³⁰ So that godless men would not rule
Nor be snares of the people.
³¹ "For has anyone said to God,
'I have borne chastisement;
I will not offend anymore;

purpose related to verse 29:

³² Teach me what I do not see; If I have done iniquity,I will not do it again'?

³³ "Shall He recompense on your terms, because you have rejected it?

For you must choose, and not I;

Therefore declare what you know. ³⁴ "Men of understanding will say to me, And a wise man who hears me, ³⁵ 'Job speaks without knowledge, And his words are without wisdom.

³⁶ 'Job ought to be tried to the limit, Because he answers like wicked men.

³⁷ 'For he adds rebellion to his sin;
