

Part 60 – The Sovereignty of Our God-The Book of Job
The Repentance of Job-God’s View of PRIDE

Job 42:1-6

Job 40:4-5 “**Behold, I am insignificant;** what can I reply to You?

I lay my hand on my mouth.

5 “Once I have spoken, **and I will not answer;**
Even twice, and I will add nothing more.”

Job 1:20-21 Then Job arose and tore his robe and shaved his head, and he fell to the ground and worshiped. 21 He said,
“Naked I came from my mother’s womb,
And naked I shall return there.
The Lord gave and the Lord has taken away.
Blessed be the name of the Lord.”

Job 3:1-10 1 Afterward Job opened his mouth and cursed the day of his birth. 2 And Job said,

3 “**Let** the day perish on which I was to be born,
And the night which said, ‘A boy is conceived.’

4 “May that day be darkness;
Let not God above care for it,
Nor light shine on it.



5 “**Let** darkness and black gloom claim it;

Let a cloud settle on it;

Let the blackness of the day terrify it.

6 “As for that night, **let** darkness seize it;

Let it not rejoice among the days of the year;

Let it not come into the number of the months.

7 “Behold, **let** that night be barren;

Let no joyful shout enter it.

8 “**Let** those curse it who curse the day,

Who are prepared to rouse Leviathan.

9 “**Let** the stars of its twilight be darkened;

Let it wait for light but have none,

And **let** it not see the breaking dawn;

10 Because it did not shut the opening of my mother’s womb,

Or hide trouble from my eyes.

Job 1:20-21 Then Job arose and tore his robe and shaved his head, and he fell to the ground and worshiped. 21 He said, “Naked I came from my mother’s womb, And naked I shall return there. The Lord gave and the Lord has taken away. Blessed be the name of the Lord.”

Job 40:8-9 “**Will you** really annul My judgment?

Will you condemn Me that **you may** be justified?

9 “Or **do you** have an arm like God,

And **can you** thunder with a voice like His?

Job 32:11 “Behold, I waited for your words,
I listened to your reasonings,
While you pondered what to say.

Job 7:11-14 11 “Therefore I will not restrain my mouth;
I will speak in the anguish of my spirit,
I will complain in the bitterness of my soul.

12 “Am I the sea, or the sea monster,
That You set a guard over me?

13 “If I say, ‘My bed will comfort me,
My couch will ease my complaint,’

14 **Then You frighten me with dreams
And terrify me by visions;**

**Job 7:20-21 Have I sinned? What have I done to You,
O watcher of men?**

Why have You set me as Your target,
So that I am a burden to myself?

21 “Why then **do You** not pardon my transgression
And take away my iniquity?

For now I will lie down in the dust;
And **You will** seek me, but I will not be.

Job 30:21-23 You have become cruel to me;

With the might of **Your hand You persecute me.**

22 “**You lift** me up to the wind and cause me to ride;

And You dissolve me in a storm.

23 “For I know that **You will bring me to death**

And to the house of meeting for all living.

Job 40:1-2 Then the Lord said to Job,

2 “**Will the faultfinder contend with the Almighty?**

Let him who reproves God answer it.”

8 “Will you really annul My judgment?

Will you condemn Me that you may be justified?

The 3 “S’s” of repentance:

1. God is Sovereign over our trials and life.

2. God is Superior over our knowledge.

3. God is Supreme over our Pride

verses 4-6

1. God is Sovereign over our trials and life.

verse 2

Job 42:1-6 1 Then Job answered the Lord and said,
2 “**I know that You can do all things,**
And that no purpose of Yours can be thwarted.

2. God is Superior over our knowledge.

verse 3

3 ‘**Who is this that hides counsel without knowledge?**
Therefore I have declared that which I did not understand,
Things too wonderful for me, which I did not know.”

Job 38:2

Psalms 131:1 O Lord, my heart is not **proud**, nor my eyes **haughty**;
Nor do I involve myself in great matters, Or in things too difficult for me.

3. God is Supreme over our Pride

verses 4-6

4 ‘Hear, now, and **I** will speak;
I will ask **You**, and **You** instruct me.’
5 “**I** have heard **of You** by the **hearing of the ear**;
But now my eye sees You;
6 **Therefore I retract,**
And I repent in dust and ashes.”

Romans 8:28-39 And we know that God causes all things to work together for good to those who love God, to those who are called according to **His** purpose.

29 For those whom **He** foreknew, **He** also predestined to become conformed to the image of **His** Son, so that **He** would be the firstborn among many brethren;

30 and these whom **He** predestined, **He** also called; and these whom **He** called, **He** also justified; and these whom **He** justified, **He** also glorified.

31 What then shall we say to these things? If God is for us, who is against us?

32 **He** who did not spare **His** own Son, but delivered Him over for us all, how will **He** not also with Him freely give us all things?

33 Who will bring a charge against God's elect? **God is the one who justifies;**

34 who is the one who condemns? Christ Jesus is **He** who died, yes, rather who was raised, who is at the right hand of God, **who also intercedes for us.**

35 Who will separate us from the love of Christ? Will tribulation, or distress, or persecution, or famine, or nakedness, or peril, or sword?

36 Just as it is written, "For Your sake we are being put to death all day long;
WE were considered as sheep to be slaughtered."

37 But in all these things we overwhelmingly conquer **through Him who loved us.**

38 For I am convinced that neither death, **nor** life, **nor** angels, **nor** principalities, **nor** things present, **nor** things to come, **nor** powers,

39 **nor** height, **nor** depth, **nor** any other created thing, will be able to separate us from the love of God, which is in Christ Jesus our Lord.
